Aqua-Sac[®] S.O.S. Bag
“A self inflating sand bag”.



Immerse the bag completely in water for 5-6 minutes, to inflate them. For faster inflation, move the Bag around under the water and squeeze the material inside.



Aqua-Sac[®] S.O.S. Bags are used in the construction of flood defence's, in a similar way to traditional sandbags.



Remove any debris from the area. Drop the bags into place to help eliminate gaps and create a seal (interleave a plastic sheet between layers of bags to improve the seal). Place bags in layers, like courses of bricks in a wall.

Re-Use and Disposal:

The bags do dry out in natural sunlight but it depends entirely on weather conditions. In winter time we would not expect complete deflation for months as rain will keep refreshing the wet bags. If the bags have been contaminated with either sewage or any kind of chemical then re inflation will not be possible. The bags are non-hazardous waste suitable for disposal in an approved solid waste landfill or incineration plant, in accordance with local regulations.

WHAT DO YOU DO IF YOUR HOME IS THREATENED WITH FLOODWATER

1. Put flood protection equipment in place (see overleaf) when there is a flood warning
2. Take items upstairs or to a high point in your property:
 - Safely store important documents such as insurance papers.
 - Move items of personal value such as photos, family videos or treasured mementos.
 - Move lightweight household belongings you can pick up easily and quickly.
 - Move items of furniture that are expensive or harder to repair before cheaper ones.
3. If it is safe to do so help the more vulnerable members of your community.
4. If possible, move your outside belongings to higher ground e.g. your car and any outdoor pets
5. Turn off gas, electricity and water supplies when flood water is about to enter your home if safe to do so. **DO NOT** touch sources of electricity when standing in flood water.
6. Move your family and pets upstairs, or to a high place with a means of escape.
7. Keep listening to local radio for updates
8. Flood water can rise quickly, stay calm and reassure those around you. Call 999 if you are in danger.

Important! Flood water is dangerous:

- Avoid walking or driving through it.
- Keep children and vulnerable people away from it.
- Wash your hands thoroughly if you touch it.
